## OH GROW UP!

**YOU BIG DUMMIE!** Remember when Fred Sanford used to say that to Lamont about six times a show? Well, if the shoe fits I think you ought to consider wearing it. I mean, let's be honest about this, some who read this newsletter still believe the old worn-out idea that Jesus was a good teacher who gave a lot of good advice, and if a lot of people would follow his teaching, the world would be a better place to live. C.S. Lewis says that believing such an idea is about the same as still believing the earth is flat. The idea has been tried, tested, and found wanting. Lewis adds to this thought.

"It is quite true that if we took Christ's advice we should soon be living in a happier world. You need not even go as far as Christ. If we did all that Plato or Aristotle or Confucius told us, we should get on a great deal better than we do. And so what? We never have followed the advice of the great teachers. Why are we likely to begin now? Why are we more likely to follow Christ than any of the others? Because He is the best moral teacher? But that makes it even less likely that we shall follow Him. If we cannot take the elementary lessons, is it likely that we are going to take the most advanced one? If Christianity only means one more bit of good advice then Christianity is of no importance. There has been no lack of good advice for the last four thousand years. A bit more makes no difference."

You may live your life thinking that you have only rejected the good advice of a great teacher but that is the thinking of (as Fred would say) a big dummy. Jesus never claimed to be only a good teacher. He claimed to be God incarnate: one who has the right to demand your allegiance; One who is the perfect revelation of the almighty God. He is the one who came to deal with evil, not by moral teaching, but by sacrifice and by changing the lives of those who will follow him. You may not have the courage or the faith to follow Jesus but do not water down his claims.

As Lewis points out, Christianity claims to be telling you about another world. A world "behind the world we can touch and hear and see." Any teaching about such a world would be very difficult indeed. But Christianity claims that just such a world has entered into our world through Jesus. What if it is true? That is my favorite question. Just think about it for a minute. What if the claims of Christianity are true? What if God is really there and has spoken to the world? What if Jesus really is the Son of God who is the only way to salvation? What if his promise that we can live forever is true? What if God really has shown us a way that the world, and your own life, can be better? What if those people around Jesus of Nazareth really did know something you do not? What if they really did see him perform miracles and what if they really saw him alive again from the grave? What if it is real?

What if all the moral positions that get laughed at these days are really the way people would be the most happy in this world and we are all missing it? The stakes are indeed high. Can we afford to sit around and be big dummies the rest of our lives? I Cor. 14:20 says "in your thinking be mature." Can we really claim to be grown-ups and let these questions go unanswered and uncared for? On what basis do we claim to love our families if we do not seek to find answers to such big questions that will change their lives forever? It is time to grow up in the faith.

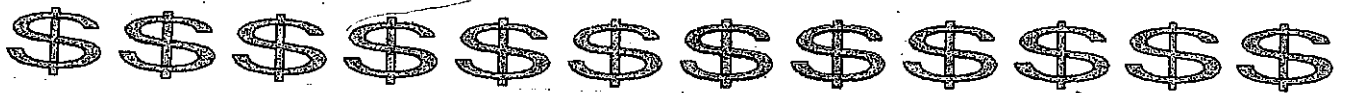


## VBS 2014 CANS

## MARCH MISSIONS EMPHASIS

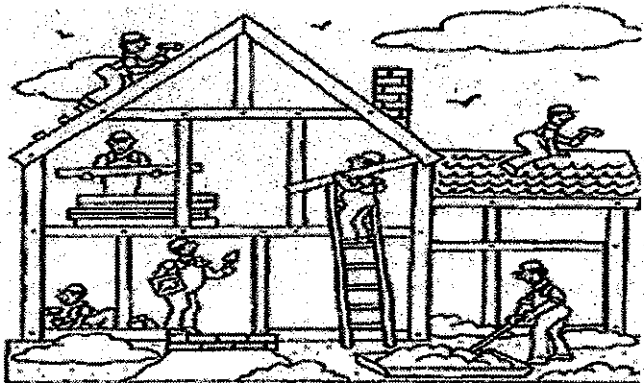

## MEET OUR NEW PASTOR

Greetings from Grampian, Pennsylvania! If you do not know where Grampian is, that's okay! What I know about Grampian is that it has been just one of the stops along the road that God has placed me on and that I follow Him. The next stop will be in Kittanning!

I was asked to share a short bio with you. In a 1984 movie, *The Adventures of Buckaroo Banzai Across the 8<sup>th</sup> Dimension*, Buckaroo is an adventurer, a rock musician, a brain surgeon, and he is challenged to save the world from a group of evil aliens from the 8<sup>th</sup> dimension. I can tell you simply—I ain't none of those things! What I am is a Christian trying to be faithful as I listen for God's voice speaking to me. My faith journey began at a young age in my life but I am not sure I understood what it meant to have faith until later in life—seems that sometimes I can be a slow learner.

I grew up in Johnstown, Pennsylvania graduating high school at Richland High School in 1979. If you do the math you just learned how old I am too! I began the process with in the United Methodist Church for ordained ministry in 2002—remember I said I am often a slow learner! I went to seminary at Asbury Theological Seminary in Wilmore, Kentucky graduating in 2010. I was ordained an elder in 2012 by Bishop Thomas Bickerton. When I come to you in July, I will be starting my 11<sup>th</sup> year in ministry.

I have a 17 year old daughter who is presently a junior at Curwensville High School. I have been single for a few years but I have found a young lady who is about to change that. On May 25, I will be married to another pastor, Ali Fisher.

I enjoy photography, bicycling, walking, summer, my three dogs, summer, and sharing the Good News that Jesus Christ is Lord of all. I look forward to serving God with you in Kittanning.

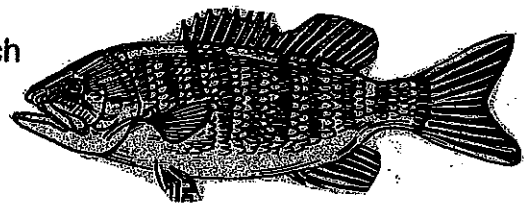
## RAINBOW ROAD APPLICATIONS

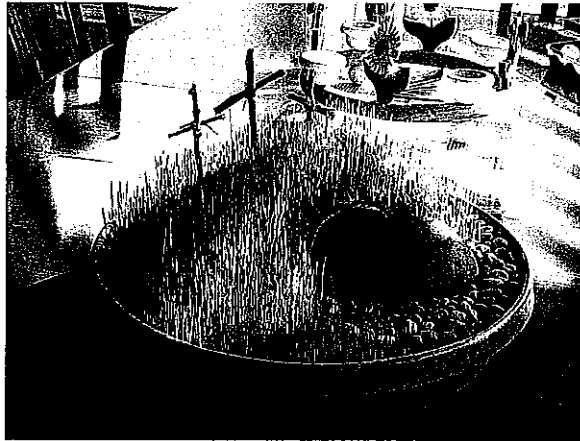

State health and food safety regulations require that all pies made with milk, milk products or eggs must be baked in a licensed and inspected kitchen (such as a bakery, restaurant or our Covenant Center kitchen which is state licensed and inspected).

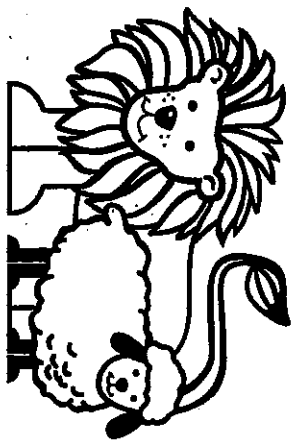
This includes crème, custard, pumpkin pies and cheese cakes. Fruit pies and other pies not made with milk, milk products or eggs can be baked in home kitchens.

Crème, custard, pumpkin pies and cheese cakes purchased from a bakery or a restaurant (which are not labeled "must be refrigerated") or are baked in a licensed home kitchen are acceptable.

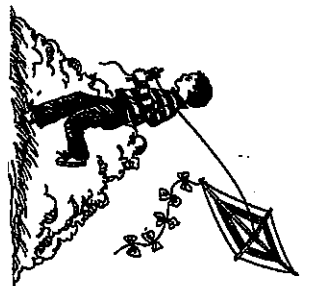




**HELPFUL HINTS**

When using shiny aluminum foil pans for pies, place the pan on a cookie sheet during baking to prevent the bottom crust from becoming soggy. Do not use this tip if using a glass or dull-finished aluminum pan. The use of cookie sheet under these pans will make the bottom crust soggy.
