**From the
Pastors Desk**

September 2015

It just seems like summer was beginning and now it is almost Fall! It was just yesterday that high school graduation was the event of the week for Kittanning students. Now, the Armstrong River Hawks are getting ready to begin a brand new season of education and sports! Lots of changes in the community have occurred throughout this summer. Soon the leaves will begin to change and summer will transition into fall.

Here at the church, it is time for a new season of ministry! Summer tends to be a time in the church when we cut back on activities and small group meetings and Sunday School. I think we do this because there has been a significant number of members vacationing and traveling during the summer and we did not want anyone to miss anything. In the 21st century church we have a hiatus in the summer and yet there are no Scriptures that talk about Jesus and the disciples preparing to take the summer off!

At First Church, our mission is to know Jesus and to make Jesus known. More than just knowing about Jesus, I want to help strengthen our faith journeys with Jesus. Faith is an ongoing and growing aspect of our lives in Jesus—even in the summer!

The 17th Chapter of Matthew's Gospel shares these verses, "Afterward the disciples asked Jesus privately, 'Why couldn't we cast out that demon?' 'You don't have enough faith,' Jesus told them. 'I tell you the truth, if you had faith even as small as a mustard seed, you could say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it would move. Nothing would be impossible'" (Matthew 17:19-20).

There is never a question about the quantity of faith but only the quality of faith. The mustard seed would have been one of the smallest things known during the time of Jesus and, Jesus tells us, that with faith the size of a mustard seed we can move mountains.

What are the mountains in your life?

What are the mountains that need to be moved in our church?

I recently asked in a sermon, "Is your faith in God growing?" And if you answer yes, "How is it growing?"

Matthew West, a contemporary Christian singer, shares these lyrics from one of his songs:

It's day one of the rest of my life
It's day one of the best of my life
I'm marching on to the beat of a brand new drum
Yeah, here I come
The future has begun, Day one
Well, every single day Your grace reminds me
That my best days are not behind me

I pray that you see that your best days are ahead of you because of your faith. Join us as we celebrate and Rally this Fall for Jesus.

CHILDREN'S CHOIR

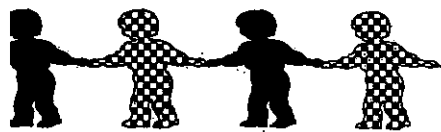

September 27th—sing during worship

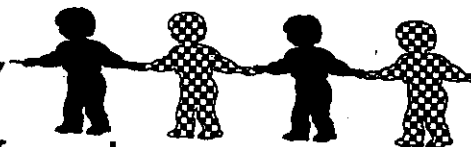


200th ANNIVERSARY TEAM

SUNDAY SCHOOL & RALLY DAY



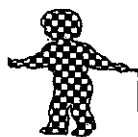
Are you ready for Sunday School? We are ready for you!

We have classes for all ages from 9:30-10:30 each Sunday morning (starting September 13).

- **Two Adult classes meet in the Covenant Center.** Jim Ternent leads a traditional Bible Based session and Brad Hellein leads a small group, multi-media, discussion group (details elsewhere in the newsletter).
- **Youth (Grades 7 thru 12) meet in the basement of the church,** led by Melissa Flanders. We often hear some lively Christian music coming up the steps!
- **Children (Ages 3 thru Grade 6) meet in the upstairs rooms of the church.** We are using new curriculum this year called "Deep Blue". The children will come to know the Bible as THEIR book and find ways to let the Bible speak to them today. We'll start out as it was "in the beginning" and move from Creation to Abraham, Sarah, Jacob and Esau during the Fall Quarter. Kelly Hoffman leads those in Grade 3 and higher, Audrey Green leads the 1st & 2nd Grades and Sue Hankey leads the 3 year olds thru Kindergarten. Each class learns the story in age appropriate language and hands-on use of the Bible. We reinforce those lessons with games, crafts, and music.
- **NURSERY,** led by Linda Powell is available for those ages 2 and under during Sunday School and ages 4 and under during worship.

The children's area upstairs is looking good with fresh paint on the walls and a new look to the floors. The rooms and teachers are saying "we miss you"!

LUNCH IS ON THE TABLE

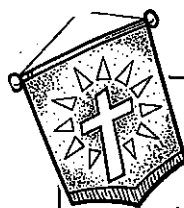

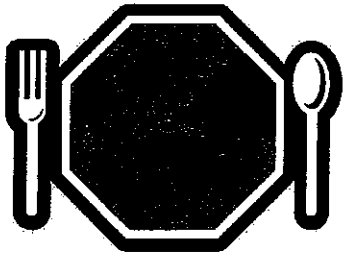


RALLY DAY

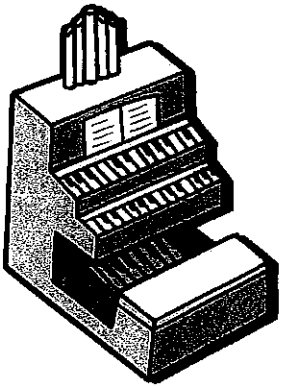
STOP HUNGER NOW ASSEMBLY LINE

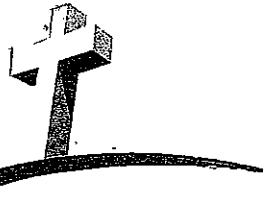

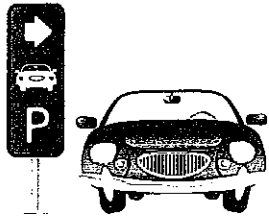

PARKING LOT

Years ago when the Capital Campaign got underway, the Trustees decided to start parking cars in the lot next to the parsonage during the festival. The proceeds going towards a payment for the roof mortgage. We paid the mortgage off earlier this year and now the proceeds of this project are designated to the building fund which is where the Trustees get their funds for the maintenance and improvements of our church properties. Over the years we have averaged over \$800.00 a year. This year we had a grand total of \$1,158.00. Breaking this total down it amounts to over 264 vehicles parking in our lot and one vendor at a cost of \$100.00 for four days. FOLK FESTIVAL UPDATE

We were blessed with great weather and hungry people at the Folk Festival this year. We had total sales of \$18426.26. This was a new record total and also the highest ever on every day except Sunday. Sunday's total was the 3rd highest ever. Due to the great effort of all who got involved, we will have \$11,522.60 to put toward church finances from the festival this year. In addition, we will now be able to use money which was kept from fish dinners to finance the festival, making a total of \$14,000 contributed to church finances at this time. Thank you to the 27 people who baked or contributed to pies as well as to all the others who gave their time to set up, tear down, and work in or around the booth. Following are some of what was used this year at the festival.
