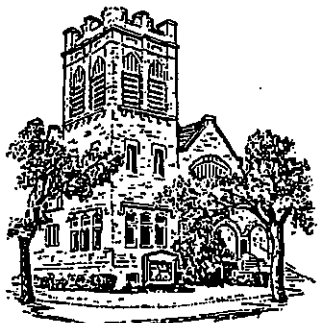

From the Pastors Desk

To the Members of the Kittanning First United Methodist Church!

This letter is from Pastor Wade, a slave of Christ Jesus. I am writing to all of God's holy people in Kittanning who belong to Christ Jesus, including the elders and deacons. May God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ give you grace and peace. Every time I think of you, I give thanks to my God. Whenever I pray, I make my requests for all of you with joy, for you have been my partners in spreading the Good News about Christ from the time you first heard it until now. And I am certain that God, who began the good work within you, will continue his work until it is finally finished on the day when Christ Jesus returns.

Okay, I have to admit, I borrowed those words from the Book of Philipians. Paul opens his letter with those words. He wrote in the midst of being in prison and faced with his own death. Amazing that he can share such words of encouragement and grace in the midst of his own fears. He writes to inspire and he writes to try and bring about unity—Christian unity. Paul writes in Philipians 1:27, "Above all, you must live as citizens of heaven, conducting yourselves in a manner worthy of the Good News about Christ. Then, whether I come and see you again or only hear about you, I will know that you are standing together with one spirit and one purpose, fighting together for the faith, which is the Good News."

I offer the same encouragement and the same request. This time of year has become the traditional time for the "stewardship letter". Each year we share facts and figures and make a plea to help the church meet its annual budget. But this year is different. Our church stands in a place that almost feels like the prison Paul was in. Please read the article in this newsletter that was written by the Finance Committee. Faced with a mounting financial obligation and monthly shortfalls that continue to push the bounds of being unable to meet certain obligations. And just like in your family, when things begin to overwhelm us we start to wonder, we start to doubt, and we start to look for ways to tighten our belt. Often we find ourselves squabbling over things that do not matter or things that we ought to be unified with each other. Sometimes we end up cutting out things that are important and necessary.

Our church faces a financial struggle. Giving has not equaled spending for some months now. The church leaders have been good stewards of the monies in the treasuries—that is they have been very faithful in using the money that you have shared in a way that is honorable to God. Now you are probably saying, here it comes, another request for money. Nope!

I want to ask you for a number of other things. (But, if you want to give, please don't let me stop you!!)

First, if you haven't been to church lately, I invite you to come back! We miss you!

Secondly, I ask you to consider this—Paul says, "You must have the same attitude as Christ" (Philipians 2:5). The attitude of Jesus is an attitude of prayer, presence, giving, serving, and witness.

1. Prayer – be in prayer for your church and the church leaders. Praying for the church seems self-evident, but to grow in our faith it means to immerse ourselves in each other's lives and stand as one.
2. Presence – Hope floats when you are present. The younger generation looks to the older generations to keep them challenged and growing. The older generation needs to look to the younger generation so that they know the church and its ministries will continue when they are gone. Strength and commitment stand when you are present.

3. Gifts – Jesus talked more about money than anything else in all of Scripture. Giving and money issues are the most pressing spiritual need or issue of the American church.
4. Service – If you believe in something, typically you do something with what you believe. Faith leads to action. Where people serve they stay. Where people serve, they love and give and share.
5. Witness – If you are experiencing something good, wouldn't you want to share it? Talk to others about the good you are experiencing at the church. Talk to others about the good things you find God doing in your life. Our faith grows as we witness to what God is doing. Our church will grow as we declare the saving power of Jesus Christ.

My encouragement for you would be simply this, let us work together as one. Let us find the unity that Christ has called us to share and look to the future together. As such, the pledge card looks a little different this year. This card is a covenant that you will make with God! It asks you to consider these five areas of commitment for 2015. Pick one, two, or all five! But remember this is a covenant that you are making with God. Place the card in your bible, your devotional book, or on the refrigerator to remind you daily of the commitment that you have pledged to God in the coming year.

Paul said this in the third chapter of Philippians, "I don't mean to say that I have already achieved these things or that I have already reached perfection. But I press on to possess that perfection for which Christ Jesus first possessed me. No, dear brothers and sisters, I have not achieved it but I focus on this one thing: Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, I press on to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us" (Philippians 3:12-14). We have such a grand history at First Church. There were countless other times when we needed our faith and God's strength to get through. In the almost 200 years of ministry that this church has shared in, I imagine that these conversations took place about money or any number of other issues. I am asking that we press on toward the goal, and that goal is to be one in Jesus.

First United Methodist Church has been blessed to have the support of friends like you for many years. I thank you for the ways in which you have offered yourself to the church. Please know, we are working hard to keep the expenses to a minimum. Please feel free to talk to any Church Council member, the Finance Committee, or you can speak freely to me as well regarding the things we are doing to be faithful stewards of the money entrusted to us.

Thank you again for your prayers and your faithfulness. I encourage you to read Paul's letter to the Church at Philippi, The Book of Philippians, and be blessed by those words of encouragement and unity. Possibly those words will speak to you in other ways as well!

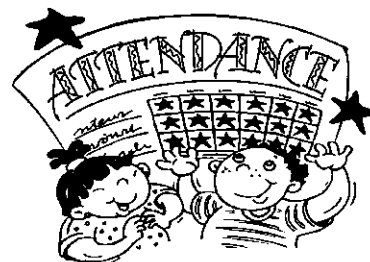

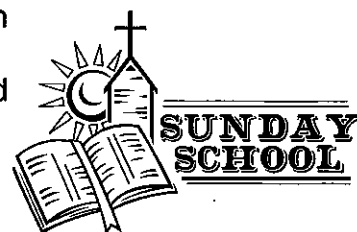

FUMC Finance Snapshot - August 31, 2014

As shown in the table below, we have accumulated an \$18,746 (or 15%) shortfall in stewardship income through the first eight months of 2014. It has continued to widen since May, when the shortfall was roughly 13%. If stewardship continues at this rate, by the end of the year the shortfall will be roughly \$28,000. As a direct result, we currently have a negative balance (-\$9,785) in the general fund. **This has become a serious problem!** For the first time in roughly 13 years, FUMC may need to forego paying part of its mission share to the conference.

While our members have always been generous in supporting special building and mission projects, it is critical that we not do so at the expense of regular stewardship, which is the main source of funding for our daily operations. Indeed, spending our resources on utilities, staff salaries, taxes, and insurance may not be terribly gratifying, but it is necessary for us to continue in our current form.

October is traditionally Stewardship Month at FUMC, when we reflect on how we are called to support our ministry. At this time, we should remember that what stewardship really means is managing things that aren't ours in the first place. We should think about what God has given us and what we are called to do with it. This includes our time, money, and talent. Please give this your prayerful consideration.

¹Ideally, the actual stewardship income should be equal to or greater than the budgeted income.

²Ideally, the actual budgeted expenses should be less than or equal to the budgeted expenses.

NOTE: Since there are other sources of funding other than stewardship income, there is no direct correlation between stewardship income and expenses. That is, stewardship income need not equal expenses in order to have a balanced budget.

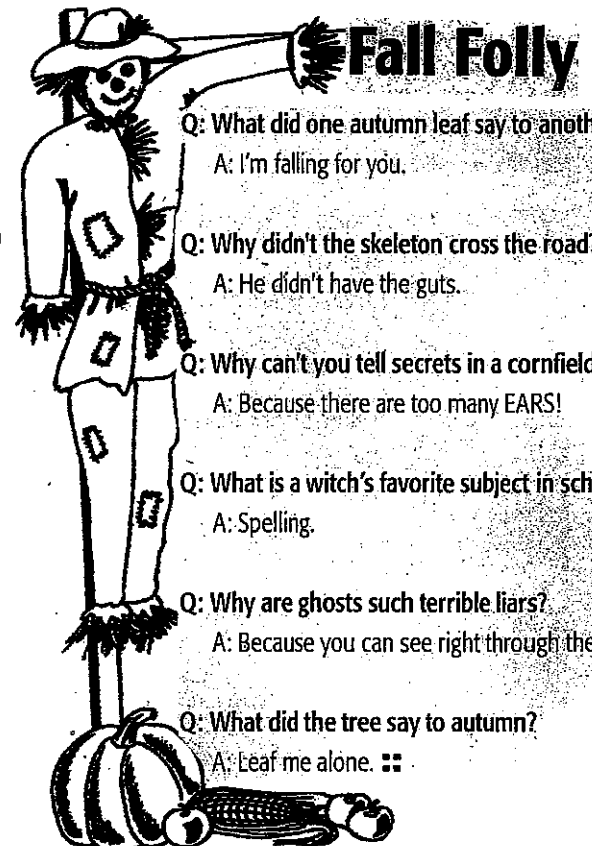

these boxes is November 10.

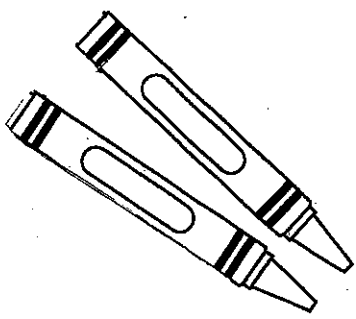

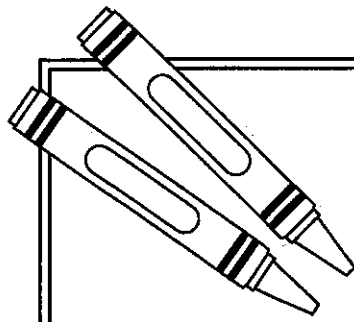
Roasted Pumpkin Seeds

You will need:

- 4½ cups raw pumpkin seeds
- 2 tablespoons cooking oil
- 1 teaspoon salt
- clear sandwich bags

How to:

- Rinse pulp & strings from seeds. Drain.
- Mix seeds, oil & salt in a bowl.
- Spread on a cookie sheet lined with waxed paper.
- Let stand for 24-48 hours, or until dry. Stir once in a while.
- Remove waxed paper and toast seeds in the oven for 40 minutes at 325°. Stir once or twice.
- Drain seeds on paper towel.
- Store in plastic bags for a great treat!
