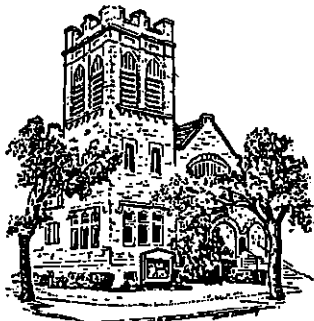

*October 2015*

Last month I spoke about faith in my letter to you. Just the other day, I was reading a devotional about faith that truly touched my heart.

Consider this...

In Mark's Gospel, he writes, "Later Jesus appeared to the Eleven as they were eating; he rebuked them for their lack of faith and their stubborn refusal to believe those who had seen him after he had risen. He said to them, 'Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned. And these signs will accompany those who believe: In my name they will drive out demons; they will speak in new tongues; they will pick up snakes with their hands; and when they drink deadly poison, it will not hurt them at all; they will place their hands on sick people, and they will get well (Mark 16:14-18).'"

Did you catch the reason Jesus rebuked his disciples?

It was for their "stubborn refusal to believe those who had seen him after he had risen."

After reading these words, I began to really think about my own faith. Is one of my big problems with the way I think about faith about how I have allowed it to be framed by intellectual and scientific categories and thinking? It needs to "make sense" to my rational self. And if this is true, then doesn't my faith really rely on the known things of this world? And if that is true, doesn't that make me want to be in control of my own life? And if that is true, have I not become my own god? (Boy I hope your head didn't explode like mine just did! But think about it...!)

From the devotional – "Faith is the movement from self-preservation to self-abandonment; from self-protection to God's protection and from my need to be in control to a surrendering to the control of God. Back to our continuum: Faith is the movement from fear through doubt into courage and onward to faith." Faith is not about what we know of this world. Faith is about the divine!

There was never a question about the quantity of faith that the disciples had but only the quality of their faith.

John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist way of thinking, once asked a question about faith. In the midst of his own doubt and fear he was told this. Preach faith until YOU get it, then, preach faith.

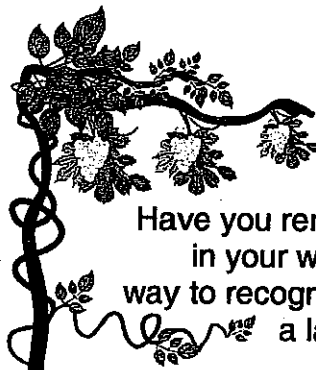
I recently asked in a sermon, "Is your faith in God growing?" And if you answer yes, "How is it growing?"

Where do we need to preach faith to ourselves? Then, when we discover the ability to surrender to God, how can we share that faith with others?

Wrestle with this awhile...

Until the whole world hears...

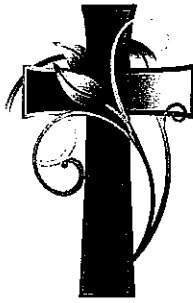

## LAY SERVANT MINISTRY SCHOOL

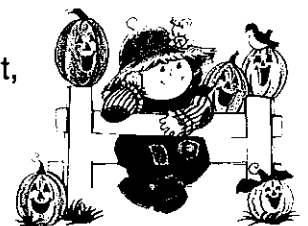

## PASTOR APPRECIATION

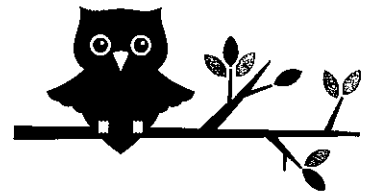
October is Pastor Appreciation Month and the Staff Parish Relations Committee asks you to remember Pastor Wade in your prayers.

## OCTOBER MISSION FOCUS
