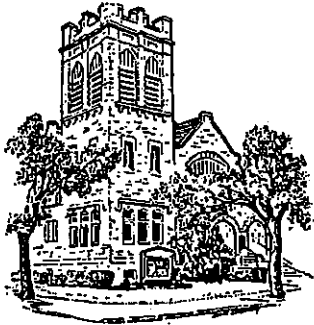
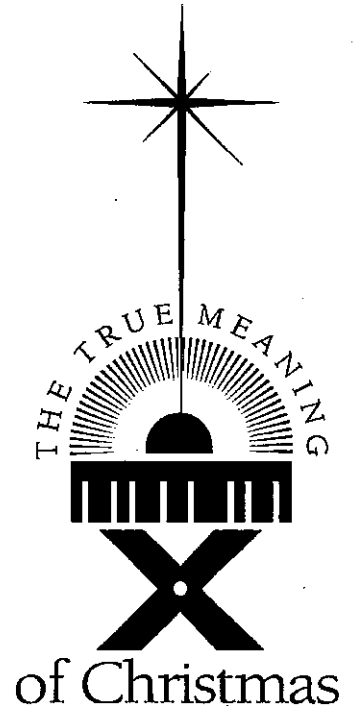

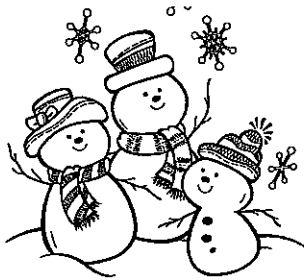

From the Pastors Desk

Advent is the time to remind us to cut through the holiday chaos and simplify Christmas. Advent is a time of preparation. Let us journey together as we prepare!

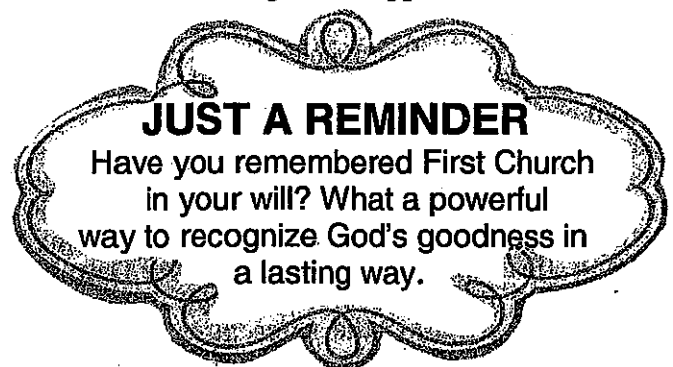
We are going to share in a series of sermons during Advent to offer to us considerations of un-complicating Christmas. I invite you to join us as we check to find peace, deck the halls with love, dash to spread joy, and dash to others with hope! These will be the things that we focus on in our messages during Advent.

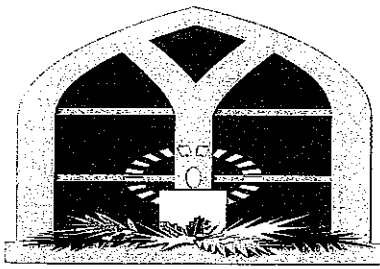
I also invite you to a different kind of worship service on the first Sunday of Advent, November 30. Our themes that day will be checking to find peace and expecting a miracle. We will share in a healing service during our regular worship service at 11:00 AM. Healing is not magic, but underlying it is the great mystery of God's love. All healing is of God. The Church's healing ministry in no way detracts from the gifts God gives through medicine and through caregivers. God heals in five areas of our lives and God heals in a number of different ways. This is an opportunity to pray with people and pray for people. It is an opportunity to open our hearts to God's great presence and power in our lives.

I love the way Eugene Peterson, author of *The Message* version of Scripture, translates a passage from Matthew's Gospel; "Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out on religion? Come to me. Get away with me and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest. Walk with me and work with me—watch how I do it. Learn the unforced rhythms of grace. I won't lay anything heavy or ill fitting on you. Keep company with me and you'll learn to live freely and lightly" (Matthew 11:28-30).

My prayer for each of us during Advent and in the coming year would be for us to begin to understand those unforced rhythms of grace. How will this Christmas be different? Will it be the usual complications or will it be a renewed walk with Jesus Christ as we learn to live freely and lightly. This Christmas give yourself as an offering to God. Because, as the angel said to Mary, "Nothing is impossible with God". *Nothing!* When people are willing to let God work in their lives, then new and wonderful things will happen.

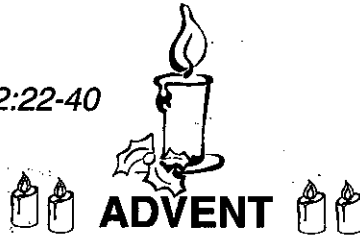

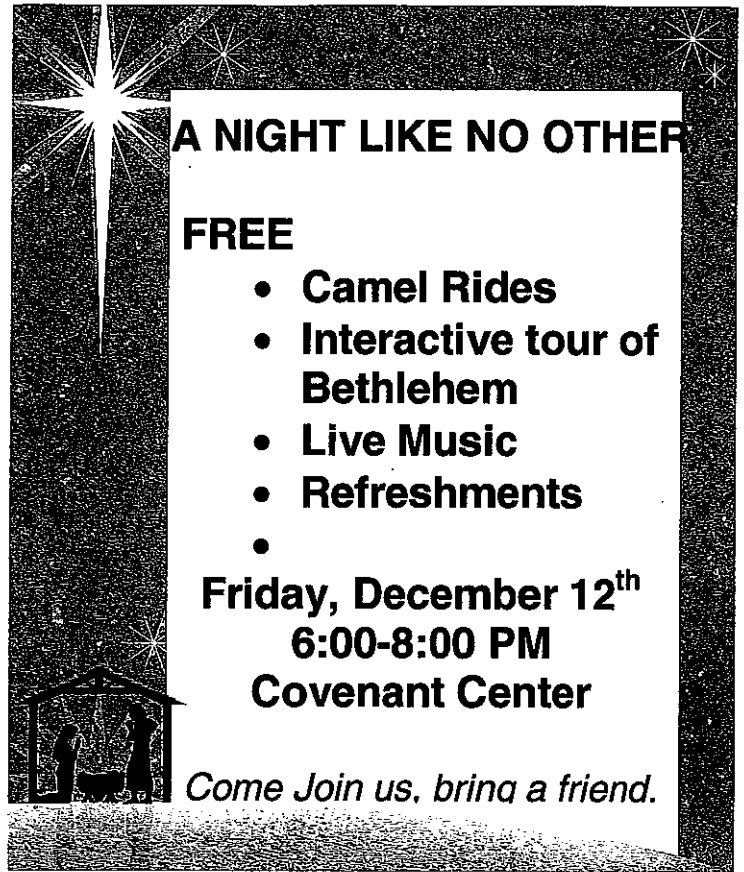

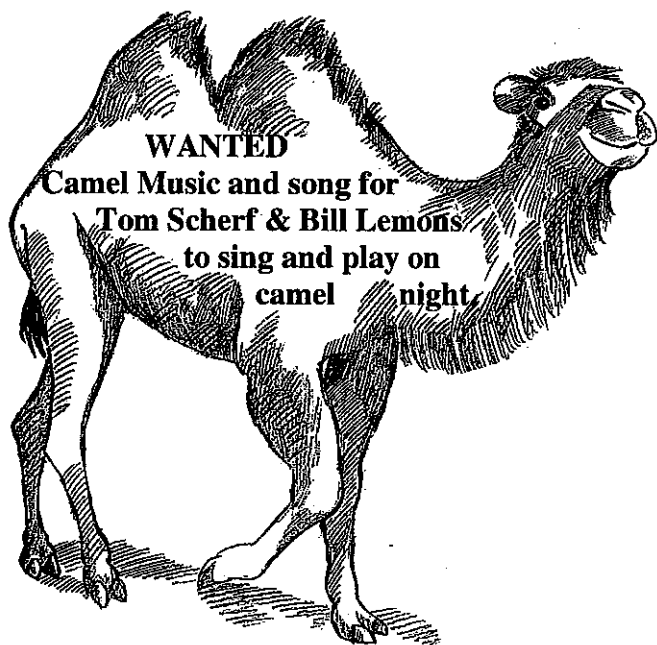

FUMC FINANCE UPDATE-October 31, 2014

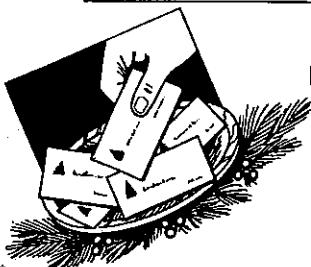
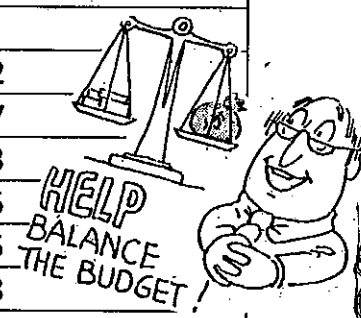
In October the General Fund saw an increase of just over \$800, ending at a balance of -\$9,000. While this appears to be progress, keep in mind that it was only possible by foregoing our October mission share payment of \$2,000. Had we paid that obligation, the general fund balance would have *lost* \$1,200 for the month. While the reason may not be clear, what *is* clear is that our stewardship giving in 2014 has been consistently lacking by over \$2,000 each month.

The Finance Committee began crafting a budget for 2015 at its November meeting, and will finalize and present it to Church Council in December. In order to balance the budget, the committee is relying on a two-pronged approach that includes both budget cuts and increased stewardship.

The preliminary budget includes over \$12,000 in budget cuts, which accounts for roughly half of the deficit we experienced this year. Because "hard" costs (such as utilities, salaries, and taxes) are difficult or impossible to cut, most of the cuts are in maintenance items, committee budgets, and other ministry-related items. Until we return to more solid financial ground, many programs can be funded from designated reserve funds such as Focus on Our Vision and the various endowments the church has maintained. We recognize, however, that this is not a sustainable solution.

The committee hopes that the other half of the deficit can be made up by increased stewardship as we move into and through 2015. Since our stewardship deficit is roughly 14% of budget, we need a commensurate increase in giving to return to conditions similar to recent years. What does this mean to the average giver? Maybe less than you think. The table below shows what kind of increase we are talking about.

If everyone who currently gives this much (per week or month)...	...could give this much instead

MISSION FOCUS FOR DECEMBER

Here is an follow-up from our recent mission emphases:

1. **STOP HUNGER NOW** - Our church donated \$1,225.41, had 30 volunteers, and helped produce 31, 772 nutritional packets in 2.5 hours! These packets were sent to Liberia to aid persons suffering from Ebola. Thank you, God!

The next SHN date will be September 26, 2015 at the Vandergriff UMC.

2. **JESUS WELL** - Our church family gave \$2,786 to the Jesus Well. This amount will build one total well, plus almost another well!! Thank you, God!

3. **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD of SAMARITAN'S PURSE** - Our church family provided 38 shoeboxes and \$315.00 to this wonderful agency. Dr. Mark Ferguson provided several hundred children's toothbrushes and toothpastes. Many of these went into our 38 boxes. The rest were donated in these various ways: HAVIN, Salvation Army, to the 3 little boys who will receive gifts from the Friday Night Circle, to the OCC collection site at Zion UMC, Sarver (the manager was so grateful to receive toothbrushes as they are sometimes hard to get in quantity), and finally the remainder will go to the Haiti Mission Trip that Zion UMC, Sarver in the near future!!! Thank you, God!



DECEMBER MISSION FOCUS

Our focus this December will be tender one as we reach out to one of our church family's sons. Joe and Sarah Heckert's older son, Joe, was critically injured in a motorcycle accident on October 17.

Joe, a 42 year old man is the husband and father of two young boys. He had been on life support and has had several surgeries. His injuries included a ruptured spleen, internal injuries, several broken vertebrae, broken femur, arm, and ribs. He has had an extensive above the knee amputation. As a welder, he is presently without an income and his future is uncertain.

This young family needs help with medical bills. Their home needs to be given alterations to make it wheelchair accessible. Joe faces a long road of recovery and rehabilitation.

As Jesus showed compassion to those who are hurting and in need, let us as a church family reach out in loving compassion as we pray for Joe and his family, as we give money to help their medical bills. If you want to write a check, make it payable to FUMC, with a memo "Joe Heckert". If you want to give cash, please write on your envelope, "Joe Heckert". May God bless you as you give and pray for Joe and his family.

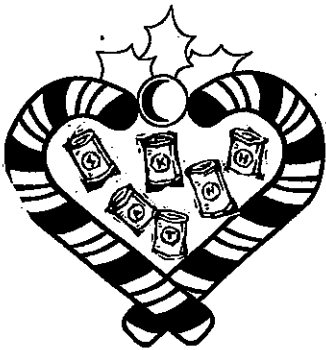
2015 VBS CANS

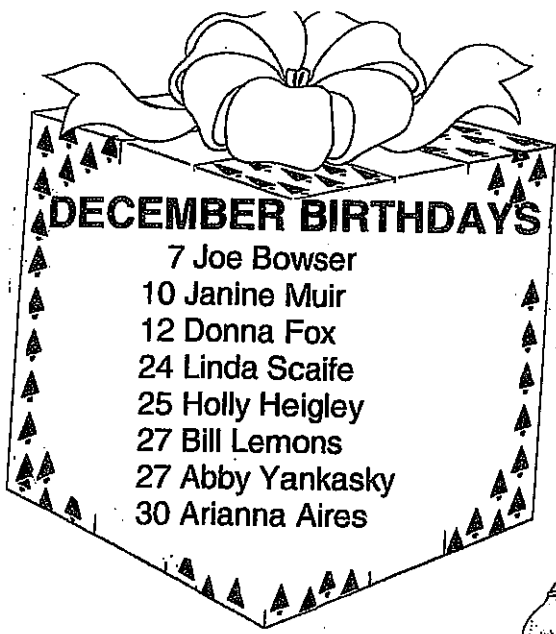

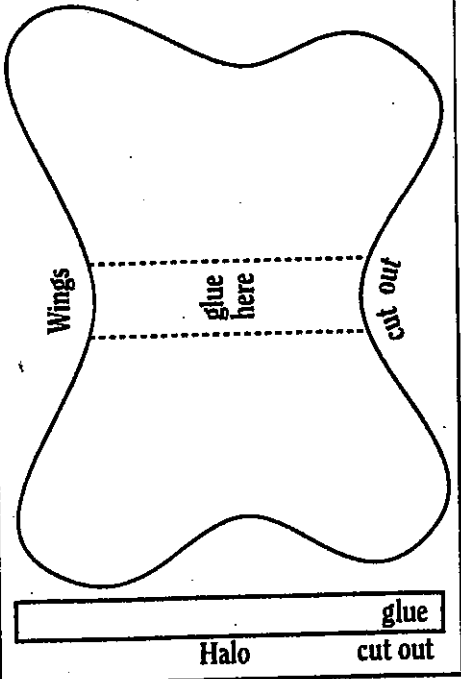
Make an Angel Ornament
