From the Pastors Desk

July 2015

WOW!! Can you believe it? A whole year has passed since I first wrote for you! We have finished our first year together, and, I have

been appointed to First Church for another year! It is good to be here with you and I continue to see God working in your midst. I am looking forward to this year (and hopefully many more to come) with you!

Last year, in our first Church Council meeting together, I asked the Council to consider five questions. Those questions were –

- 1. What is going well at First Church?
- 2. What is not going well at First Church?
- 3. What is a barrier that could be removed to improve your sense of participation and success in the life of First Church?
- 4. What role in the life of the church would you like to take on?
- 5. What are the needs in our congregation and communities that would point toward new opportunities for the ministry of First Church?

They shared a number of great answers and I thank them once again for their help!

One of the things that stood out to me in the answers shared was a sense of needing growth—personal growth in our intimate and ongoing relationship with God, and, growth in our church family and our ministries outside of the church with the diverse community around us.

Later on in the first year, we developed a strategic plan for the coming years that centered on three main points. Those points are worship, growing, and serving. I want us to begin to think about the first of these.

Over the next few months we will focus more on prayer—personal prayer, corporate prayer, and praying together as a church, and praying for our worship. I hope that we can challenge each other, through our worship, to grow in our faith walk with Jesus Christ. As a church, our mission is to know Jesus and to make Jesus known. More than just knowing about Jesus, I want to help strengthen our faith journeys with Jesus. Faith is an ongoing and growing aspect of our lives in Jesus. I hope to offer a number of short-term, small group studies in the coming year, to encourage us along this path of faith. I hope you can be a part of what is offered. Don't forget, from September to May, First Church offers Sunday School for all ages. You are always invited and welcome!! Hey, we might even have to start some new classes if enough people came!!

John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist way of thinking, calls us to press on, with God's help, in the path of sanctification toward Christian perfection. I am glad we can, and will, press on together!






WELCOME ALL YOUTH

This worldwide program is volunteer-based in packaging high protein, dehydrated meals for use in crisis situations. The meals are packaged by volunteers, using an engaging assembly line process. A team of 80 volunteers can package 20,000 meals in just two hours!!!

The **date of assembly is Saturday**, **September 26 at the Vandergrift First United Methodist Church**. If you are interested in being a part of the assembly line let me know.






This includes crème, custard, pumpkin pies and cheese cakes.






