- \* Hand towels (not kitchen, cleaning or microfiber towels)

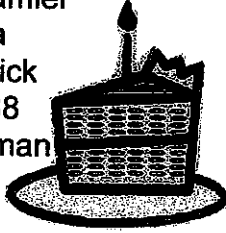

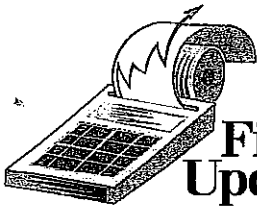
## 2019 VBS ALUMINUM CANS

## Finance Update

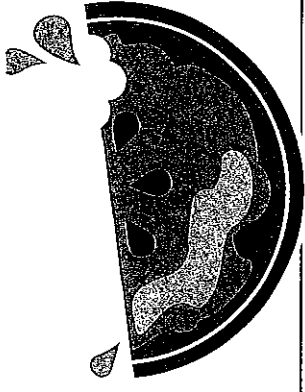
As of this writing, we are settling in with our new pastors Deb and Brenda and as the dust settles we are getting a clearer picture of our financial health. As we have for the past year or more, we continue to face unusually daunting financial challenges.







At the end of June, we have an \$8,648 deficit in the General Fund and we are behind on conference apportionments by \$10,090. Unfortunately this is the worst we have seen in well over a decade. A large portion of the deficit is due to the fact that we must pay the Allegheny River Charge for pastoral expenses one month in advance, meaning that the July expenses were paid in June. This was a large expense (\$5,868) at a time when we were already struggling.

Our new position within the Allegheny River Charge was designed to reduce our expenses over time. Because of the timing of payments described above and the fact that the move was accomplished mid-year, we will not see any significant savings in 2018. However, it should represent moderate financial relief throughout 2019 and beyond.

We are beginning a new chapter in the book of First Church in Kittanning, and we sincerely hope it will be a bright one. Please give consideration and prayer to this situation, for not only increased resources but also wisdom and prudence of the leaders who are stewards of those resources.
