



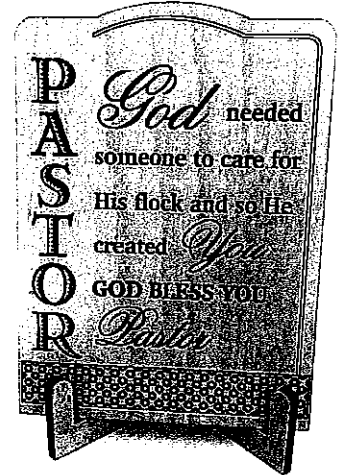

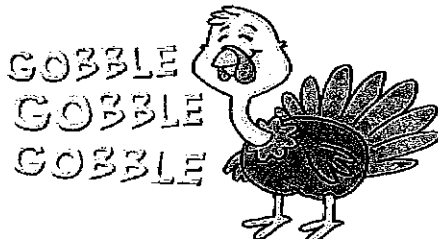

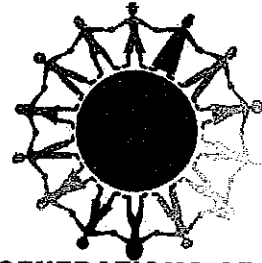

**NEW GENERATIONS OF FAITH
2016 - ...!**

If you were with us in worship on September 11, 2016, you will remember that this was Anniversary Sunday. We had a special guest, a former pastor—Rev. Bob Lash. Rev. Lash is retired but he remembers fondly the time that he and his family served First Church.

One of the things that Rev. Lash shared was about the 200th Anniversary. He asked us to not let it be, First United Methodist Church of Kittanning, 200 years. He asked us to approach it as, First United Methodist Church of Kittanning, 200 years and...!

Friends, we are not going to roll up the carpets, lock the doors, and close up after this year! More importantly, we have much more life left in us. It is time to begin to put away the party hats, the noisemakers, and other party items and pick up our faith and begin to move forward.

What does that mean?

Matthew 28 tells us, “¹⁸ Jesus came and told his disciples, “I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. ¹⁹ Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. ²⁰ Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age.”

In our English grammar, an imperative sentence is a type of sentence that gives advice or instructions or that expresses a request or command. An imperative sentence typically begins with the base form of a verb, as in Go now! The implied subject, *you*, is said to be understood; (*You*) go now!

When we look at the Greek text that Matthew was originally written, the imperative in verse 19 is not *go*. The imperative is to *make disciples*—*YOU* make disciples! While sometimes going is a part of making disciples, our commission is simply to make disciples. The mission of First Church is “to know Jesus and to make Jesus known.” Once we know Jesus—that is, become a disciple—we then become disciples making new disciples!

I am so happy to announce that our leadership is taking steps to help us to accomplish the Great Commission of Jesus and our mission of knowing Jesus and making Jesus known. Our leadership voted in September to allow **About Face, Church Outreach Consultants** to help us in this journey. I am excited about this partnership! It does not come without cost! There is a financial cost but there is also a cost to each of us as we are challenged to begin to think about our faith and how we can share that faith. We will talk more in the coming months regarding About Face, but I could not wait to share this wonderful news! Stay tuned!

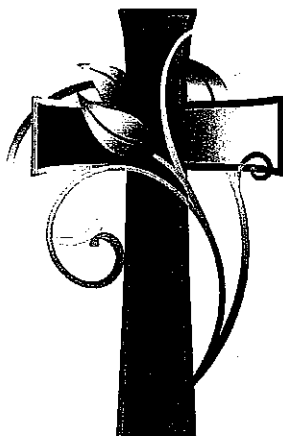

Small Group Study "**Revival**" will be held during October. Those on this journey will meet at the Covenant Center on **Thursday nights at 6:30 PM.**

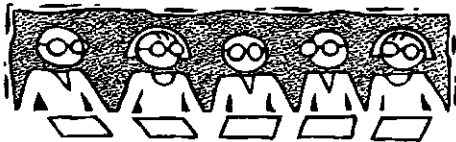
MORNING SMALL GROUP

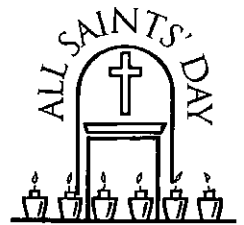


CHARGE CONFERENCE

STOP HUNGER NOW UPDATE



As our church family enters into the fall, here is an update on the recent **Stop Hunger Now** event:

- * On September 17th **30,024 meals** were packaged by **80 people** in **2 hours** at the Leechburg UMC.
- * Our church contributed **\$1,145** of the \$8,879 total contribution (8 churches participated).
- * A surplus of \$179 was given to SHN. We will find out later how that money will be used.
- * In the past **4 years 118,555 meals** have been packaged and **\$32,166.99** collected!!!

OCTOBER MISSIONS FOCUS

We will focus our mission giving on the **Light of Life Rescue Mission**, located in the North Side of Pittsburgh. Founded in 1952 as Harbor of Hope Rescue Missions, it served as a refuge for transient men. In 1957, it was named Light of Life Rescue Missions and since then, has expanded programs to include women and children.

This Christ-centered mission immediately meets the needs of the poor and homeless men and women by providing hot meals. **Every \$2.58 we give** provides a hot meal. To the hungry and homeless persons, it is more than a meal....it is a taste of hope. It nourishes a pained soul.

Light of Life provides **100,000 meals each year**, breakfast and dinner, seven days a week. **The money we collect will go towards paying for these hot meals.** Please ponder life as a homeless person and pray as to how you can give. May God encourage us to give freely and generously. Blessings!

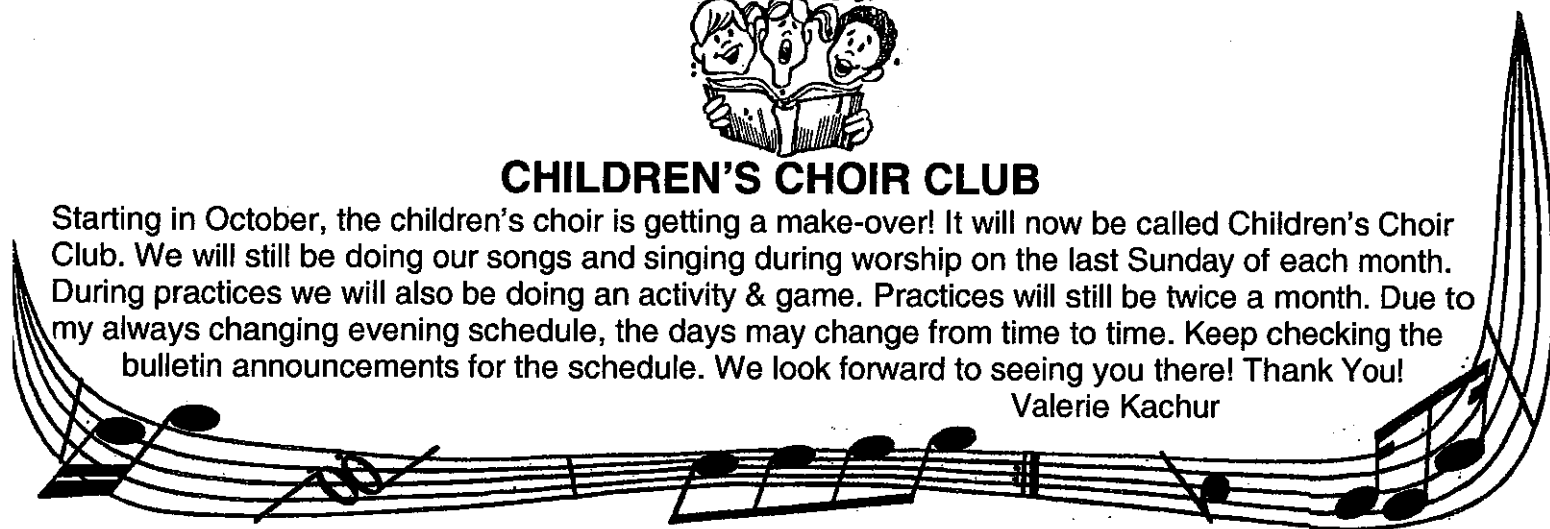

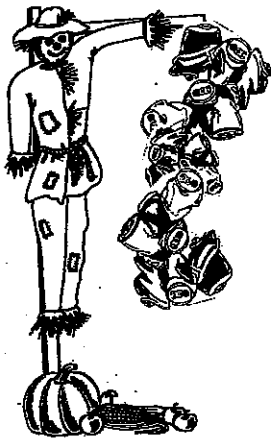


CHILDREN'S CHOIR CLUB

Rev. Bob Lash 1963-1969

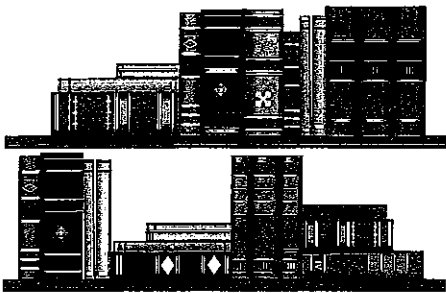
Great to see you! I am a stranger to most of you, but I am no stranger to this Church because I had tremendous ministry--at least from my point of view--here for only six years. I would like to have stayed longer, but the Cabinet wouldn't let me stay. I got requests three different times that I move from here and I kept resisting them and finally I said to my wife, "I can't continue to do this. We are going to have to accept the next appointment"-- which I did. To tell you the truth, I regretted it because I wasn't as happy at that appointment as I was here. At any rate, this is a glorious, glorious day for me. I doubt that there is anybody here who has looked forward to this day with more excitement and anticipation than I. In fact, you are going to laugh when I say this but I am totally serious. This is the last thing on my bucket list. I really mean that and I kept saying that to my daughter, Kathy. And she said to me, "I kept saying that if I live to 2016, I want to go back to Kittanning; they'll be having an anniversary" and she said "Dad, if you make it I will see to it that you get there". So, Kathy is here today. Kathy was 3 years old when we moved here, and 9 years old when we left. Kathy stand up and we can get a look at you. She is good to look at isn't she! Her sister (a few of you would remember) Rita lives in Melbourne, Florida. I am just unbelievably filled with emotion today. I had here as pleasant a 6 years of ministry as I had any place at all where I served. It was a privilege to be your pastor and I'm just delighted to be invited back to say a few words. I also find that this is a bittersweet experience because I look around and faces that were here 50 years ago aren't here anymore. I even remember where many of them sat, but you know they are with us today. I believe conclusively that they are watching us. They know what is happening here and they are excited about the ministry that your pastor and all of you are performing in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ. I miss them all so much, I remember them regularly. This was an amazing Church when I was here, and I am sure it still is. This was probably the best educated congregation that I served in all my ministry. It also may have been the most dedicated wonderful, wonderful people. I have to mention Jim & Alice Ternent. They got their awards today. Let me tell you about my main experience I had with them. My wife and I were extraordinarily close to them because interestingly enough, they had daughters--two daughters exactly the same age as my daughters. The first year that I was here, in March of 64, there



was a dreadful flood. We had a board meeting and let out the board meeting. The water came up so fast that when we opened the door the water was coming in on Vine Street. Now that seems impossible, but it happened. And the basement of this church was totally filled with water. The parsonage basement was totally filled. We had to move out, and so, Jim & Alice invited us to move in with them. So what did we spend--six or eight weeks. No just three days. Just seemed to them like 6 or 8 weeks but they were among the great friends we had here, and they have continued to be my friends. I thank God for them on a regular basis. I commend you for your ministry here.

I had an occasion and I am always—um—I don't want to overdue this. I can remember when I was a kid and my Church had anniversaries and old preachers stood up, and I thought they droned on forever and I don't want to be guilty of that. I had an occasion to visit the community of Kittanning two years ago in the summer time, and I had with me two of my very best friends. And I wanted them to see the Church, but we came on a Friday and I don't know whether your Church is still closed in the summer on Friday but it was closed 2 years ago and I was so disappointed but I thought, well, I am going to check every door and see if by any chance I could get in some place. Well, I did find a door open because your custodian was working. So I was so proud to come in and show my friends through the Church. I showed them every nook and cranny and reminisced about it. We just had a delightful time and what impressed me most was the beauty of this Church, the degree in which you have taken care of it. This was true outside where the lawn was mowed impeccably; there were flowers planted. I was delighted in the changes that have happened since I was here 50 years ago. So, I was just thrilled to see what you have done. So I want you to know that I commend you for taking such good care of God's house. I have always believed that when a Church looks like somebody cares for it, then that is an indication that the people also care for God. Your ministry here continues to be very effective and I ask God's blessing upon every one of you in the process. And so in my brief remarks, I want to offer a challenge, if I may. You have completed 200 years of ministry in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. Well, now what is going to happen? Don't let it be First United Methodist Church, Kittanning Pennsylvania, 200 years of ministry, period. No, let it be First United Methodist Church, Kittanning, Pennsylvania 200 years of service of ministry -!!! God Bless all of you, Thanks for listening to me. You can only imagine what a thrill it is for me to have been here 50 years ago and to have lived long enough to share in this great anniversary. Think how fortunate you are to be a part of a church that has lived and ministered for 200 years--not very many people can say that. So keep up your great ministry. Keep constantly in service to our master, and above all as I keep saying to people as a Church and as individuals, keep looking up. In the name of the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

A SCHOOL OF CHRISTIAN MINISTRY

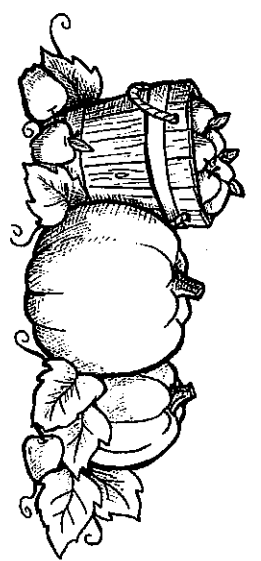
You may have heard of the Museum of the Bible, a new museum which is expected to open its doors in fall 2017 in Washington D.C. For the last few years the museum has been sending out traveling exhibits around the world. We are so excited to be hosting their *Sacra Pagina* exhibit on campus at Biblical Life Institute on October 21-31!





The *Sacra Pagina* exhibit includes 40-50 items that explore the study of the Bible both in and out of the academic community. Some of the items that make up the exhibit include cuneiform tablets, Hebrew and Greek manuscripts and fragments from the 2nd century BCE through the 11th century CE, copies of various Bibles throughout the Middle Ages, and additional archaeological artifacts. Also, there will be lectures on selected days and times about *Art and the Bible*, *The History of the English Bible*, and *Biblical Names*.

Admission to the exhibit is free, and you are welcome to bring groups from your church and community (anticipate an hour or so to work your way through the exhibit).
